### **From the Hadith:**

- **Seeking Knowledge is Obligatory:** The Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) said, "Seeking knowledge is an obligation upon every Muslim." (Sunan Ibn Majah)
- **Elevating Status:** The Prophet also said, "Whoever follows a path to seek knowledge, Allah will make easy for him a path to Paradise." (Sahih Muslim)
- **Knowledge over Wealth:** The Prophet emphasized that knowledge is more valuable than wealth because knowledge protects you while you have to protect wealth.

**Knowledge as a Means to Piety:** The Quran states that those who have Education is essential in Islam as it leads to spiritual growth, better understanding of the faith, and personal development. It is a lifelong obligation that benefits both the individual and society.

This shows that Islam highly values education and encourages all Muslims to seek knowledge throughout their lives.
